Names Index

Titles without names have not been indexed.

Most names in the Letters lack initials or given names.

Idiosyncratic spelling and poor writing add to identification difficulties.

Both initials and RN [Register Numbers] have been ascribed where possible.

Names in *italics* are those who seem to be convicts or prisoners.

Names in normal type are of settlers, soldiers or government staff.

Convicts [in italics below] may have been employed by Government at some time and therefore be shown both in normal type as well as italics.

Absence of initials or RN means identification to be uncertain without further inquiry. Convicts [both 'Colonial' and from UK] have a full given name [where known] if the RN is unknown.

Names with an * are included in Barker, D J [see page 43].

Identifications should be checked. Particularly:

- 1. the same name with an entry in both italics and in normal type.
- 2. the same name with an entry with initials and an entry without them.
