The petition of the undersigned being gentry, clergy & others in the Parish of Greasley & Eastwood in the County of Nottingham on behalf of Samuel Wilcockson now a convict in the Portland Convict Prison

Humbly (illegible word) for the above named Samuel Wilcockson was convicted at Nottingham on the 18th day of July 1849 and was sentenced to 15 years transportation for setting fire to a dwelling house.

Your petitioners respectfully beg a mitigation of this sentance and they have every reason to hope there are circumstances to lead to this result – it appears the Cottage in question was upon waste land for which no rent had been ever paid

and that one of the witnesses on the trial who swore to the prisoner setting fire to the Cottage has a previous (illegible word) against the prisoner as can be proved having said "we'll jail thee Samuel" and that the rest of the evidence was of a circumstantial nature and your petitioners have every reason to hope & believe that Wilcockson's conduct since his imprisonment has been marked by truly good behaviour.

Your petitioners therefore hope that you will kindly recommend the prisoner for a Free Pardon or Mitigation and your Petitioners as in duty bound will ever pray.
