

22 July 1875. Mr. J. Edwards of Aubrook reports that a man named Charlie Gibbons Exp. is wandering about the bush in the neighborhood of his place without any clothes to his back or means of subsistence more than what he gets from the shepherd's charity, and he believes him to be of unsound mind from the manner in which he roams about. C. Gibbons Exp. taken to York Hospital where Dr. Hope says he is dangerously ill. Is to be sent to Invalid Depot at Perth.

Ordered to be sent to the Lunatic Asylum, Fremantle.

7 July 1880. At 11 a.m. P. C. Edwards left for York with Charles Gibbon Exp. 883 in a spring cart. Gibbons was sick and destitute and was left at the York Hospital. The 10/- fee for hire of the cart was paid by the Resident Magistrate.
